Our Annual Meeting is Sunday, December 5th. At that meeting we will discuss our financial realities. You will see our 2010 receipts and our projected 2011 budget. Of course the budget is dependant upon many factors - job loss in our congregation, how many families have taken a salary cut, and the positive aspect is how much our church has grown. All these figures will be reviewed: Budget, Baptism, Growth, and Losses.

We will also vote on adopting permanently the Elder model of church governance. We had a four week class on Eldership last year and I preached on it last month. As you pray about this decision, please ask yourself, "What is Biblical?" Talk to friends in other churches about their governance. I believe it takes four to five years for any organization to get the bugs out of their system, so we do still have some issues to smooth out. Please be in prayer for church and ministry as these important decisions are discussed and decided.

Ministry has been going great! I have been spending the bulk of my time working with the Youth Ministry, College/Career Ministry, and with L3 (leadership training). Let me update you on what's been happening in these ministries.

Starting with the Youth Ministry... October was a very a good month. It started with some of our boys attending an event called *Men at the Cross* with the men of the church. The focus was on older men discipling younger men, which will hopefully become more commonplace at our church. Emphasis was placed on men showing boys how to be men and follow Jesus. Then, the following week, we held the 29-Hour Famine. This event was a great success with an amazing guest band and speaker. The Youth experienced fasting along with hearing messages on prayer, the importance of reading Scripture, and fellowship. They also collected food and clothing for the Phoenix Rescue Mission, and they shared in fellowship with the congregation at-large to break their fast. The meal was delicious! Thanks to those who provided and cooked it! Later in the month the youth also attend a show by a Christian Comedian named Tim Hawkins who was hilarious. It was a nice to laugh and hangout. The Youth have also had two camp cookouts in September and October. We would like to thank you for your support, acknowledging our financial need, to continue this dynamic ministry. I also want to thank the many leaders that make this ministry happen! Thanks Krystal, John, Andrew, Ashleigh, Soshi, Fidel, Judy and everybody else! Your service is greatly appreciated.

The College/Career group has been holding steady and strong. Recently, the group finished studying Romans and going through the evangelism curriculum *Walk Across the Room*. Culminating the completion of these studies we celebrated by going out to eat at Buffalo Wild Wings, which was great fun. In the near future we will be doing a four week series on four topics of interest: 1) Spiritual Warfare 2) Islam 3) End Times 4) *The Book of Mormon*. Those in the group have been assigned different areas to study and they will be sharing their findings with the group.

With L3, I am leading three groups this year. There are two people in the second year and

seven people in the first year. We have been meeting for about a month now and I'm already seeing people grow through the material. In November, we plan to attend a conference at the Scottsdale Franciscan Renewal Center. This will be a wonderful time to recharge in prayer and listen to speakers on leadership.

Overall, I am very pleased with the way all of these ministries are going. I have also been in conversation with many small group leaders that are doing *Experiencing God*. I would like to thank Nancy Higgins for helping in the small group area while I have been involved in other ministries.

Hash Brown Potato Casserole

Serves 10-12

2-lb. Bag of frozen hash browns, partially thawed (Southern style)

1 tsp. salt

½ tsp. pepper

½ cup melted butter

1 can cream of mushroom soup

½ cup chopped onion

2 cups grated sharp cheddar cheese

1 pint sour cream

Topping

2 cups crumbled corn flakes

¼ cup melted butter

Mix hash browns, onion, salt, pepper, sour cream, soup, chopped onion and melted butter together. Fold in cheese. Place in greased 9 X 13 dish. Bake for 30 minutes. While baking mix corn flakes and ¼ cup of melted butter in small bowl. Sprinkle on top of casserole and bake 15 minutes more.

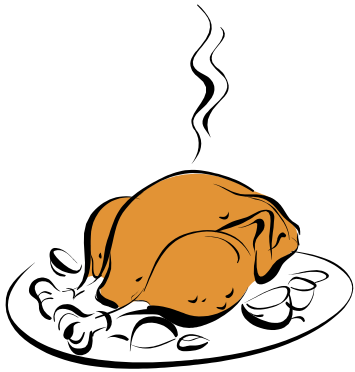

Church-Wide Thanksgiving Dinner



It has been a few years now since we, as a church, have shared a Thanksgiving dinner together. This year, our kitchen committee is coordinating a church-wide Thanksgiving Dinner that will take place on Sunday,

November 21st, after our 11am service, in the C Bldg Fellowship Hall (lower level of Educational Building). This dinner will consist of turkey, dressing, potatoes, gravy, two vegetables, dinner rolls, and dessert.

In years past, we had everyone bring a dish to share in the form of “potluck” and had everyone stand in long lines to get their meal. This year we are taking a different approach. The tables will be waited on by our youth and our dinner plates will be served to us at our tables. The dinner has been planned. In order for this dinner to be a success, we are asking for your help. The ministries and Sunday School classes have been divided so that each part of the dinner is provided by you. This is how it is divided:

Turkey – we are asking for turkey donations. We will let you know when they start going on sale in the local grocery stores and then we will collect them and prepare them here at the church. Don Higgins will head up the turkey-cooking team.

Knowing God

In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was blameless and upright; he feared God and shunned evil. He had seven sons and three daughters, and he owned seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen... He was the greatest man among all the people of the East.

[Job 1:1-3](#)

For most Christians we go through life with a sense that we know God. After all, we've read God's Word; we've walked with Him and have had experiences with Him. But do we really know God? What happens when the bottom falls out? What happens when everything you've known God to be in your life is turned upside down and you are left dazed and pondering the very essence of your relationship with Him and who He really is?

Job was a blessed man of God. He was upright, rich in many ways and was described as the greatest man among all the people in the east. Job wanted for nothing and he was abundantly blessed by God. He benefited from God's protection. Even Satan recognized Job's status as favored by God.

“Does Job fear God for nothing?” Satan replied. Have you not put a hedge around him and his household and everything he has? You have blessed the works of his hands, so that his flocks and herds are spread throughout the land. [Job1:9](#)

Job knew God as this unfaltering life source; faithful to uphold the stature of the blameless, abundant in blessings and a consistent shield. This is how Job knew God. Do you think maybe Job was too comfortable in this way of life? I would imagine Brother Job was much like we are today. We have a system (if you will), a way of doing things and we have always done it this way. We tend to place God in the constraints of our own systematic living; whether it is the way we do church, our family and relationships, work etc. We come to know God in a particular way in those areas and expect that this is just the way it is. And yes, God is unchanging. He is the same yesterday, today and

forever; but we come to know our God in different ways because of His sovereignty and permissive will.

It is when you lose your job after 20 years laboring for the same company or when you are diagnosed with a rare form of cancer yet you have been active and healthy most your life. It is when you are forced to go through circumstances that you did not see coming and were not prepared for, situations that devastate your life and rattle your faith that you begin to see God and you begin to truly know Him through unlikely experiences.

God doesn't always reveal himself in the manner in which we desire. A quote from the devotional *My Utmost for His Highest*, by Oswald Chambers will better put it in perspective: "At times God will appear like an unkind friend, but He is not; He will appear like an unnatural father, but He is not; He will appear like an unjust judge, but He is not." God allowed for Satan to completely devastate Job's life. We always tend to think, how awful for poor Job that he had to go through such turmoil. And yes, God restored Job and blessed him with double. At the heart of the matter, I believe God was most concerned about Job's relationship with Him. What an awesome revelation. Because of this trial, Job can now know God on a more intimate level, as Father, healer, redeemer, peace, joy and strength. God knows us better than we know ourselves.

O Lord, you have searched me and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise. You perceive my thoughts from afar. [Psalm 139: 1-2](#)

I believe God wants us to know Him better. As we come to know Him in these life lessons it will better equip and enable us to become more like Him.
